WHAT WE WILL SEE

Tour Mozambique and Malawi safari and beach. A diverse and complete tour. Ocean environment of the coast, from tea plantations, to the warm welcome of Malawi, safaris in **Majete Wildlife Reserve** in the Shire Valley, a success story of restocking and conservation. Present in Majete are all the big five, lions, leopards, blacks rhinos, elephants and buffalos as well as sable antelope, zebras, eland and *Lichestein's heartebeest*. We will enter the mid of the park even at night for safaris in search of predators.

Then to Ilha de Moçambique Island World Heritage Site, a jewel of tradition and culture that can not be missed on a trip to Mozambique. The meeting with the local people in Malawi and Mozambique, remain in our hearts for their simplicity in the joy of living: places still untouched and little tourist immersed in nature, animals, villages, markets, a journey through two countries so unique and so unforgettable.

The first tea plantations in Africa were introduced in the late nineteenth century precisely in Malawi: the views open up spectacularly in huge and rolling hills covered by a perfect green mantle and tea. Walking through the immense spaces of the plantations we meet the tea workers who patiently pluck the young leaves at the top of the plants, leaf after leaf.

Ilha de Moçambique, a small island a **World Heritage Site**, rich in culture, traditions and contradictions that make it really fascinating. And the island from which Mozambique as a country derives its name and was the first capital city; we'll tell you about the history of this country that we love and know deeply.

Behind the **Quirimbas National Park** we will hung on for a few days on one of the most beautiful beaches of Mozambique on the Indian Ocean: the coasts amaze us for their beauty and tranquility.

The northern Mozambique, rural and quiet, away from the bustle of the capital Maputo. The main **ethnic** group, the Macua and their deep traditions that are handed down from generation to generation. The island of Mozambique, Ilha de Moçambique, is not just a mere island, but an island that gave its name to the entire country: Mozambique. As well as being a World Heritage Site on paper, it was the first capital of Mozambique; There are many stories to tell on the two island cores; the Stone City, built by the Portuguese and Macuti City, with typical thatched roofs. The rich Mozambican history passes through this island. The majesty of the fortress, palaces, squares, churches, take us back to Europe, but the African sun reminds us



that the other side of the hemisphere, in Ilha, you live in this time and in this space is not mythical . The pristine beaches in the north of Mozambique, the palm trees and the intense colors of the Indian Ocean and the typical sleepy rhythms of the swahili culture. We will be close to the **Quirimbas National Park**, remembered for its high biodiversity and for the views of the most beautiful beaches on the East African Coast. The terrestrial vegetation is a mosaic of coastal forest and river, mangroves, bamboo, acacia forests and mixed miombo, palm trees and dry vegetation providing refuge to several species of mammals, reptiles, amphibians and birds.

In Malawi, welcoming and warm country: its people have a warm and hospitable heart that in no other country in Africa we have ever heard. In the far south of Malawi blossoms a park that has an incredible story: Majete wildlife reserve boasts the famous Big Five: buffalos, lions, leopards, elephants and rhinos. Proclaimed in 1955, it is located in the Lower Shire Valley, at the bottom of the Rift Valley. 700 km2 of nature, between forests of miombo (the popular tree) and riverine vegetation. The Majete is an incredibly beautiful reserve, but also one of those success stories that we would more often hear and tell. Thanks to an agreement between public and private, the Government of Malawi and the African Parks, the involvement of local communities without whom this would not be possible, dozens of species in massive quantities have been reintroduced. We speak of 2550 animals including elephants (Loxodonta africana), blacks rhinos (Diceros bicornis), African cape buffalo (Syncerus caffer), eland (Tragelaphus oryx), sable antelope (Hippotragus niger), waterbuck (Kobus ellipsiprymnus), nyala (Tragelaphus angasii), Lichtestein's hartebeest (Alcelaphus bucelaphus), impala (Aepyceros melampus), zebras (Equus quagga) and warthogs (Phacochoerus africanus). Present are also mammals such as kudu, reedbuck, silvicapre, suni and bushpigs. Among the large carnivores present, are hyenas, leopards, lions, often spotted next to Thawale lodge. Not only nature. Majete is an example also for the awareness and respect that has been created between the communities living around Majete for sustainable tourism. In less than 10 years, workers have gone from 12 to 150, all permanent, made up of micro enterprise projects, environmental information and education. No doubt the park is now famous here in Malawi as an example of success. We arrange the day and night safaris in one of the most exciting and fascinating experiences that you can do in Majete, one of the few areas in Africa where it is allowed to do this activity.

The first tea plantations in Africa were introduced in the late nineteenth century precisely in Malawi: the views open up spectacularly in huge and rolling hills covered by a perfect green mantle and tea. Walking through the immense spaces of the plantations we meet the tea workers, who patiently pluck the young leaves at the top of the plants, leaf by leaf, to fill the huge baskets on their backs. Markets and villages are the perfect setting with their colors, their scents and the joy and the traditional hospitality of local people. The major African cities with their amazing rhythms and contrasts, the colonial architecture and the magical atmosphere as the sun prepares the evening show of the sunset.

Away from tourism, away from the beaten circuits, despite the poignant beauty of its landscape, its hospitable and incredibly friendly people, the kilometers of pristine beaches of golden sand, Malawi is a country not yet discovered by tourism and this makes it even more fascinating.

MEANS OF TRANSPORT

All distances will be covered with one or more means Toyota or Land Rover or similar off-road 4 × 4 or any vehicles we consider fit. A further provision, in the case of nights camping: mattresses, refrigerator, food, field kitchen, 12/220 V. current to recharge the batteries, two-way VHF, GPS, notebook to download digital photos and movies, satellite phone (cost 5 euro / min), first aid kit and a good travel library, with our guides to travel with.

ACCOMMODATION

Always lodge accommodation. The nights in Majete Wildlife Reserve in the magnificent Thawale lodge in the heart of the park, winner of numerous awards such as eco-lodge. In Mulanje exclusive accommodation reserved to us in ancient colonial house, where Africa Wild Truck is based within a historic garden in the tea plantations Africa Wild Truck eco camp and lodge. In Nampula



overnight in simple, well-run hotel; Ilha de Mozambique overnight in recently rehabilitated palace overlooking one of the island's historic squares. In Pemba three nights in beautiful eco-lodge in the south of one of the best beaches in the country Ulala lodge. The rooms in the lodge / chalet / hotel, is intended, unless

The facilities have been carefully chosen following an idea of land conservation and sustainability of travel, preferring positions in close contact with nature. THE PERIOD/SEASON

Temperatures depend largely on the season, from the latitudes and altitudes. On the right is a table indicative of average temperatures in the different seasons. The hottest month is November, the coolest month is June / July. The dry season is from April / May to November. The wet season runs from December to March / April, during this time you can see the parks in their green splendor; some babies of mammals are born in this period as well as many birds cross the mating season, changing plumage and courting females. We recommend both seasons, both in fact have a special charm. August is ONE MONTH DRY, IDEAL FOR NORTH OF MOZAMBIQUE!

A SAFARI GUIDE

The numerous game drives (English definition that describes the excursion in 4×4 organized for the sighting of animals), will take place in the daytime and at night with the jeep. It is not required to take special preparation except the desire to get up at dawn and patience required in search of animals. Note that Safari will be held during the coolest hours of the day (sunrise and sunset), when animals are easier to spot. Being self-driven, however, we may decide to stop on a scene for as long as possible, always following the rules of the park. The safaris are conducted in open jeeps equipped for the safari.

The boat safari on the Shire River in Majete Wildlife Reserve is an exciting experience in the warm heart of Africa. Here the boat safari is not to be missed. Besides us, there will be a further professional guide who will accompany us for the duration of the safari to better enjoy the close contact with nature. The experience is very interesting especially for close point of view that you can enjoy boating; observe animals during their daily activity on the banks of the river is really a privilege for photography enthusiasts!

Photographers during the safari will always be permitted to bring their own camera equipment. The guides will aim first of all to put the vehicle in the best position, where safety and security permits. Inside the park the jeep will NOT communicate by radio with each other, to avoid the crowd on an animal and thus preserve the peace.

Then the vehicle must be in the right place at the right time to see what you want; we prefer that a sanctuary of nature as the Majete Wildlife Reserve preserve this spirit of adventure that so characterizes it.

Important information: in the parks or in the camps, will be made to sign a disclaimer of responsibility required to access given the nature of the place.





















TRAVEL PHILOSOPHY

We call our trips, "expeditions", a word which seems to better encompass the spirit of adventure and discovery of wild places, the capacity of necessary adaptability and the desire of sharing this experience with others.

Our programs are carefully prepared and are born from our personal experiences over the years of the places where we spend most of the year. This allows us to share the knowledge of the environment and local communities to whoever wishes to experience an adventure rather than an organized trip. During our expeditions, we like to improvise, a ballgame in a small out-of-the-way village or take a break to taste the local cuisine, or stop to meander through the colorful stands of fruits and vegetables in an outdoor marketplace.

We don't travel with air conditioning observing Africa through closed windows, but we live breathing in the smells and even getting a little dirty from the red earth without thinking all day about how much further we're going, when will there be roads of asphalt or what will we eat for dinner that night.

We experience Africa smelling the atmosphere, absorbing the colors, experiencing the local fruit and vegetable markets, being surrounded by children on the road without prejudice.

People who travel with us are not just thinking about reaching a destination but about enjoying the infinite moments during the trip to appreciate the spectacular sights of Africa even when we stop and there is nothing to do. "Doing nothing" transforms your sense of hearing into listening and your sense of watching into seeing. We prefer to "lose" time in order to better appreciate the wonders of Africa.

We don't appreciate those who always want to know "what can we do for fun", what activities or hobbies, when there really is nothing to do but wait for the sunset or for a lion to yawn: Africa has a different rhythm of life. We don't appreciate those who travels with their entire house in their suitcase and who wants to find all the comforts of home on the road; stress must stay at the airport because it does not fit with this continent.

Who are appalled and shocked at a local food dish or who cry because there is no hot water need not apply; these are luxuries we give up in respect for the communities of a Continent that suffers poverty and underdevelopment.

We don't appreciate those who do not have respect for animals or nature, who waste water, energy and resources without environmental respect, who does not ask for help and does not give help and who does not take care of our equipment.

This is our philosophy: think like us and you will be rewarded.

TRAVEL PROGRAM



DAY I BLANTYRE CHILEKA AIRPORT - MAJETE WILDLIFE RESERVE, MALAWI

Arrival in Blantyre around 14:00 with Ethiopian Airlines. The country is welcoming and warm: its people have a warm and hospitable heart that in no other country in Africa we have ever heard. Away from tourism, despite the poignant beauty of its landscape, its hospitable and incredibly friendly people, the kilometers of pristine beaches of golden sand, Malawi is a country not yet discovered by tourism and this makes it even more fascinating. After meeting at the airport, we will drive immediately to Majete Wildlife Reserve, to get to the heart of the park and safari. Overnight at the lodge, located in the park overlooking a waterhole where we often spotted elephants and nyala. *Full board*.

DAY 2 MAJETE WILDLIFE RESERVE

Introduction to the park. First day safari in the morning, with the possibility of spotting species such as buffalo, elephants, lions and nyala. Return to camp for lunch. In the afternoon, night safari and return to camp for dinner. Stunning location of the lodge, in the mid of the park where often spotted are shy antelopes, baboons, or, if lucky, elusive leopards. *Full board*.

DAY 3 MAJETE WILDLIFE RESERVE- MULANJE FOREST RESERVE

We will cross the Shire river and will climb to 800m altitude after the city of Blantyre to reach the massive Mulanje and the spectacle of the tea plantations in the late afternoon. The hills are like endless expanses with bright green leaves and only the red space of the labyrinthine routes through the plantation. Overnight in old colonial house, set in the plantations. Full board.

DAY 4 MULANJE MOUNTAIN FOREST RESERVE

Walking through the vast spaces of the plantations. We meet the tea workers, who patiently pluck the young leaves at the top of the plants, leaf by leaf, to fill the huge baskets on their backs. The first tea plantations in Africa were introduced in the late nineteenth century precisely in this area of Malawi. We can enter the magical forest of Mulanje and dedicate this day to a short trek in the forest to the Likhubula waterfall, surrounded by greenery, including endemic chameleons and unique plants such as the famous cedar of Mulanje, a protected species.

Legends and stories are part of Malawian culture that describes the Mulanje mountain, "Island in the Sky": also the reason the site has been proposed in the list of World Heritage Site. Then we will be told some legends from those who have always lived under this mountain spread over 650 km2, which with its 3002 meters is the highest in the southern tip of Africa. For those who wish, you can reach the CCAP hut, (5/6 hour) with a hiking to the summit of the island in the sky. Spectacular scenery will open behind us and finally we will arrive in the afternoon to a simple shelter of CCAP, one of the largest, from which we can observe the south-eastern slope of the peak of Chambe, located at 2557 m altitude. Among the activities, we can visit the Mulanje market, to discover the day life of Malawians or visiting community project AROUND AWT and we can visit the communities living around our base. Overnight in shelter or in old colonial house, like the previous night. *Full board*.

DAY 5 MULANJE - BORDER - NAMPULA

Customs formalities for entry into Mozambique. Rise early and travel the day to cross Mozambique. A red soil track will lead us in the steps of the many villages in the dusty town of Nampula; a long day of travel through the fertile highlands of northern Mozambique, through Alto Molocue, mentioned area for the beautiful landscapes typical of the tobacco plantations and the many inselberg that characterize the whole area. Hotel accommodation in a quiet area, with pool and restaurant. *Half board*

DAY 6 NAMPULA - ILHA DE MOZAMBIQUE

Entry in the town of Ilha de Moçambique, crossing its bridge (3 km) that connects it to the mainland. We will live in contact with the two souls of the city: the Macuti City, built with the typical thatched roof, and the Stone City, founded by the Portuguese at the beginning of the sixteenth century. Arab influences, the Portuguese African, Indian blend into the culture of the island rich in history and the past that started the Mozambican identity. Overnight at the hotel on Mozambique Island, in the seventeenth century Palazzo, where we will arrive in the late afternoon. Bed and breakfast













DAY 7, 8 ILHA DE MOZAMBIQUE

From Mozambique Island derives the name of the entire country; This World Heritage Site was the first capital of Portuguese East Africa. The importance of the island was and still is a lot, so much so that today lies in overcrowded conditions. Here are the schools, markets, labor and people still move from the coast to come and live here, on a 3-km wide strip of land, at its widest point, just 500m. Breathe the scent of the ocean, as lost in a time that seems not to exist. The atmosphere of Ilha hit so many poets and artists who have dedicated their verses. Put simply, we will try to leave soothed by its sleepy rhythms from its lived air. The decadence of its buildings and its rich architecture will be food for thought for better understanding of colonialism phases. Walking along the promenade, admire the fortress, to get lost in its market, hear the muezzin calling to prayer, walk on the beach and watch the peace of the people who live there: the island's own philosophy takes us halfway around the world. Overnight in seventeenth-century colonial house rehabilitated recently. Bed and breakfast

DAY 9 ILHA DE MOZAMBIQUE - PEMBA - MECUFI

Beautiful bay between fishing villages, huge natural harbor, the city of Pemba is renowned for the southern beaches. The sea is turquoise and golden beaches frame the picturesque and animated district. We'll move to the south, about thirty kilometers on the white beaches of Mecufi, where we will arrive in the afternoon: the colors of the sea are incredible. Overnight in eco-lodge on the beach. *Full board*

DAY 10 MECUFI

The beautiful beaches will make us relax, we will have the opportunity to see dolphins and swim on deserted beaches, including tides and we can organize a diving point. Overnight stay in eco-lodges, as the previous night. Full board

DAY II MECUFI

A landscape marked by tides and a life without clock, dictated only by the rhythms of nature. And all this is possible? Here in Pemba it certainly seems so. Overnight stay in eco-lodges, as the previous night. *Full board*

DAY 12 PEMBA-INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT.

At 12:00 about starting off to Pemba international airport heading to Dar es Salaam. Arrival or other destination.

No obligation to vaccination. Write to us to have more information!

We recommend these vaccines:

- tetanus
- typhoid fever
- hepatitis A and B

Concerning malaria, disease transmitted by the bite of the female Anopheles mosquito, its prevention is accomplished, first of all, with a mechanic prevention i.e. avoiding getting stung, following these rules:

- sleeping under mosquito tents
- using insecticide to get rid of possible mosquitos
- after sunset, when mosquitos are more active, avoiding leaving parts of the body uncovered, wearing light-coloured long trousers and long-sleeve shirts, because dark colors attract mosquitos and spraying parts of the body uncovered with Autan Extreme

For the use of any possible antimalarial drugs we suggest that you consult your Public Health Service; health norms change very rapidly.



We suggest that you take with you a small supply of these medicines:

- analgesics/fever reducers: acetylsalicylic acid and nimesulide
- antibiotics like ciproxin or amoxicillin or clavulanic acid
- antimalarials: anyway carry with you 2 packs of Lariam for emergency cases
- antidiarrheals: loperamide or kaolin in case of symptoms (to use only if really necessary!)
- rehydration salts: in case of fluid leaks
- · against car or air sickness: a pack of pills or chewing-gums
- antihistamines: in case of allergic reactions
- scissors, tweezers and thermometer
- suntan cream
- insecticides (like Autan Extreme)

LUGGAGE

Due to space and cohabitation reasons each person shall have just a big backpack (max 15 kg), with max. dimensions 30x40x50 cm (60 liters) besides a standard small bag with photopraphic equipment.

We recommend that you comply with the dimensions.

AFRICA WILD TRUCK SUPPORT

SOCIAL COMMITTMENT

We think that the contact with local people and cultures is one of the essential aspects of a travel. We support some territorial and social maintenance projects, both directly, involving our travelers into donating to <u>AROUND AWT</u> and indirectly, visiting distant areas bringing economic development and suggesting to donate one's own contribution to projects as conservation or social projects

We are supporting associates and members of associations like \underline{AITR} , Italian Association for Responsible Tourism and \underline{TIES} , International Ecotourism Society.

We live here so we have the possibility to monitoring the political and social situation of our destinations, communicating, if possible, all relevant information to travelers before leaving.

ECONOMIC COMMITTMENT

We lean on suppliers, products and services representing the option that is the most ethical available, even when it means paying a price reasonably higher compared to other options on the market.

We use accommodations which are chosen carefully, following an idea of conservation of the territory and sustainability of the travel, preferring positions in close contact with nature. Where possible we lean on small accommodations managed by local people that live on the territory, like us.

We don't lean on facilities or suppliers where we know there is exploitation of labor.

Where possible we stock up in the markets, buying fruit and vegetables directly from small producers, thereby supporting small economies.

We encourage travelers to buy local artifacts that do not harm the environment and that do not support illegal trafficking.

ENVIROMENTAL COMMITTMENT

• We use the Internet and e-mails as main means of communication; this minimizes the waste associated with the use of printed paper.

We use, where possible, recycled paper for all our printed releases. We support and donate part of our takings to organizations like <u>AROUND AWT</u> and other associations also through the programming of the travels/expeditions. We are members of the <u>TIES</u>, International Ecotourism Society and of <u>AITR</u>, Italian Association for Responsible Tourism.

We minimize the waste like electric energy and water using the truck's batteries to recharge the electric material and managing the reserves of water in an accurate way.

We recycle: nothing is thrown away in Africa! Where possible we deliver part of what we think is no longer useful, to those who need it. Besides we follow, where possible, this simple rule: what in Africa is harmful for the environment and cannot be recycled must be taken back home! Used batteries are a simple example.

We use small facilities that minimize negative impacts on the environment. We lean, where possible, on facilities built with local materials, as well as facilities that use renewable sources of energy like solar panels.

YOUR SUPPORT

Inform on your travel destination before leaving. Read books and consult tourism guides to collect information on culture, politics, geography, religion and traditions of the places you are going to visit. Learn a few basic words you'll need to communicate; sometimes a few words can make you get on touch more with the local culture. Inform on how to behave to respect customs and beliefs.

Dress in a respectful way. It's really easy to cause embarrassment or offend with an inappropriate clothing.

Buy local objects and use local services; this increases the local economy. But be careful what you buy: do not feed illegal trafficking or types of trade that are harmful to nature.

Pay a fair price for what you buy. Negotiating is always part of the local life; small sums of money mean big sums for a local family.

Ask permission before taking photographs and if you promise someone to send a photo, or a gift, please, keep your promise.

Avoid showing wealth and opulence especially in poor communities, where you are a guest.

Help local communities supporting development projects, rather than giving huge tips to individuals. Together we can develop new ideas. Take a look at the projects we support like <u>AROUND AWT</u>.

If you want to leave something, as for example giving material to a local school, or cloths to whom needs them, try to give them to an influential person. In this way the material will be divided as fairly as possible. Do not give money or medicines to individuals: we know projects to which we can give this type of material.

Never feed wild animals, especially within the parks: wild animals have not to depend on man for their subsistence.

Respect the environment: avoid leaving garbage around and if you smoke, please, do not leave your cigarette butts.

Once home think how you can help the development programs to help the country you've had the privilege to visit. Choose a Tour Operator that follows a travel philosophy that supports eco-tourism.

We support some social maintenance projects, through scientific popularization, writing guides and articles, photography, donations, our projects of <u>AROUND AWT</u>, visiting distant areas and so bringing economic development; if you know topics, groups, projects we don't know share them with us: we can support them and ensure that many people may be involved.

INSURANCE

A Travel insurance covering cancellation, curtailment and all medical expenses including air evacuation is compulsory for all clients traveling with AFRICAWILDTRUCK. It is under traveller's responsibility to make sure that the insurance covers travel activities (planned or voluntary) and all traveler's needs. Some travel activities of a dangerous nature (eg, diving, horseback riding, biking, etc ...) bring with them the risks to the health of the traveler or even death. It is responsibility of the traveller to be familiar with these activities and accept the risks that may arise from their practice, as well as make sure your travel insurance policy covers the practice of these activities. The traveller is required to have read and to carry while traveling the insurance policy.

HEALTH

While being able to give guidance on the obligations of vaccinations, we are not doctors. It is responsibility of the traveler to make sure you have detailed advice from the medical side. AFRICAWILDTRUCK cannot be held responsible for any damages or problems arising from this failure. Travelers with health problems, pregnant women or those who have just returned from a trip in other countries need to carefully control the obligations and comply with the instructions of your doctor. Medical expenses incurred for any admissions or check-ups are the responsibility of the traveler.

OBLIGATIONS OF TRAVELERS

It is responsibility of each traveler be provided with an individual passport for all the countries visited, as well as tourist and transit visas and health certificates that may be required. They must also follow the rules of prudence and diligence, all the information supplied by the organizer, as well as regulations and administrative or legislative provisions relating to the country or countries visited. The participants are called upon to answer for all damages that the organizer may suffer as a result of their failure to fulfill

obligations above. The traveler must provide the organizer with all the documents, information and evidence in its possession relevant to the exercise of the right of subrogation against third parties responsible for the damage and is responsible to the organizer of the injury caused to the right of subrogation. The traveler must notify the organizer in writing, at the time of booking, any possible special needs (eg vegetarian meals) that may be the subject of specific agreements on the travel arrangements provided that it is possible to implement.

BAGGAGE

For reasons of space and coexistence, the traveler can have only one big backpack up to 15 kg with maximum dimensions of $30 \times 40 \times 50$ cm beyond the classic handbag with camera equipment. We recommend that to respect the dimensions. In case of excess weight and size could be a fee of $\leqslant 50$ per kg.
